Frequently Asked Questions

What is this workshop about and why are they occurring?

This workshop is to help parents and caregivers learn to protect tamariki from sexual harm through practical tools and confident conversations. The workshops are preventative in nature and are not being delivered in response to any specific concerns or incidents within early childhood education services. Rather, they reflect a commitment to supporting communities to build confidence and protective behaviours that help keep tamariki safe and thriving.

Who is it suitable for?

Anyone who cares for or works with tamariki — parents, grandparents, foster carers, ECE teachers, coaches, youth leaders, and community members.

Is it free and how long is it for?

The workshop is completely free of charge and two hours long.



Do I need to know anything beforehand?

No prior experience or knowledge is needed. The workshop is designed for everyone.

Do I need to register?

Registering helps us plan the workshops and ensures that we have sufficient room for everyone.

Can I bring my tamariki to the workshop?

Due to the nature of the content and the workshop duration, we recommend that attendees arrange alternative care for tamariki during the workshop. Infants are welcome to attend with their parent or caregiver.

I am an ECE teacher or manager, can we work together to plan delivery?

Yes, we are happy to discuss with you the best way to engage with your community. We can run special sessions to suit your community.

Is online safety covered?

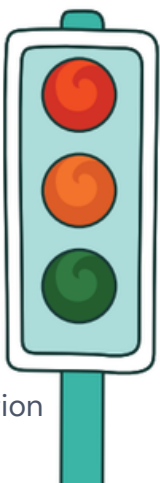
The workshop focuses on ECE and primary aged tamariki, but we will cover guidance on keeping tamariki safe in digital environments also.
